Whales are the largest animals in the world, even larger than some species of dinosaurs. Ironically, whales are among the gentlest creatures we know. There are people who go through great lengths to help **them**.

One such case occurred in 1988, when three young whales were trapped in the sea. It was close to winter and the sea had begun to freeze over. Whales are mammals that require oxygen from the air, so the frozen ice was a great danger as it prevented them from getting air. All they needed was a tiny hole in the ice for them to breathe through. Volunteers from all over the world soon turned up to help these creatures. They cut holes in the ice so as to provide more breathing holes for the whales. These holes would also serve as guides for the whales so that they could swim to warmer waters. This effort was a success although one whale drowned.

Although the whale is very huge, it is not hindered at all by its size when it is in water. Whales have tails that end like flippers. With just a gentle flick, it can push itself forward. The skin of a whale is so smooth that it does not create any friction that can slow the whale down. A whale's breathing hole is located on the top of its head, so it can breathe without having to **entirely** push its head out of the water. It is also able to eat its food down without breathing in any water. Whales are protected from the cold seawater by body fat that is called blubber. This is so effective that a whale can even get overheated in the cold temperatures of the sea.

Whales live in the ocean but in terms of behaviour, they are more similar to humans than fish. They live in family groups and they even travel in groups when they have to migrate from cooler to warmer waters. The young stay with their parents for as long as fifteen years. Whales are known not to **desert** the ill or injured members; instead, they cradle them. Moreover, female whales have very strong maternal instincts.

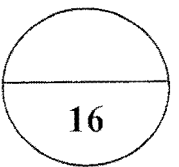

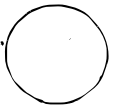

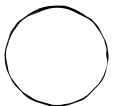

Finding affordable housing has been a big problem in the USA during the last three decades. This article will explore the causes and the consequences of the crisis. It will also state some possible solutions based upon the government and people's contribution.

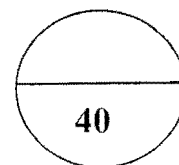
Housing has been the biggest bill for a family these days. Every year the price to rent a single apartment rises. The owners have to keep raising the cost to pay the taxes imposed on them. But people in need cannot rent these apartments because they don't have a good income. Sometimes their jobs lay them off while, in addition to their bill, they have a family to be fed and dressed. Some of them don't have any kind of employment at all.

Families that cannot afford an apartment by themselves sometimes share with cousins, brothers, aunts, and uncles. When all these people sleep together, they do not receive enough oxygen. They are exposed to carbon dioxide that can cause serious illnesses to them. Worst of all, some people cannot get a place to sleep at all. Many children who sleep in the streets are also the result of this crisis. Those kids who do not have any kind of support from anybody just have to find a way to survive. Here they are causing serious security problems. They do not go to school or get any basic family instructions. **They** are involved in crime, robbery and many other dishonest activities.

The government has tried many projects to solve the problem. Recently, billions of dollars have been spent to build more houses. In 1981, the government invested \$32 billion, but within 8 years the amount had been reduced to \$9 billion, which had caused a **surplus** of homeless population in that period of time. Another \$34 billion were spent again in 1990 for more housing. Social organizations have also taken good steps to improve the situation. The Central Arizona Shelter Services (CASS) provides homes for 400 single adults. The Center for the Homeless, another powerful organization, provides not only homes but free food and goods. The Committee on Temporary Shelter offers a wide range of services including case management, vocational training, medical and mental health care and transitional and permanent housing. There exist many other associations that are giving similar assistance to the needy.

We shouldn't wait only for the government support, but we can do much more to improve the problem.

As summer comes near , many children are really happy to forget about school for a few months. Studies have found that children typically forget between one and three months' worth of school learning during the summer months. Spelling and math abilities suffer the most, while reading is not really **influenced** by the time off. The most probable reason for this, is that most children read occasionally outside the classroom, whether newspapers, magazines ,books , or video game guides. However, their math and spelling skills only get exercised in the school setting.

The original purpose of summer vacations was to let farm children have time off to help work in the fields in the high growing season, but this reason is no longer valid since fewer kids actually work on farms today. Some cities in the United States, such as Los Angeles, have moved to a year- round school calendar, **which** may help reduce the academic decline that occurs during the long summer vacation. Most cities maintain the normal nine and a half-month calendars. To improve skills and to maintain a good level of preparation, teachers recommend trips to museums, summer camps, vacations with educational components, and visits to libraries to keep kids mentally alert and interested throughout the summer.

There are other educational systems that provide vacations while still keeping students' skills sharp. For example, in Japan students attend class of seven weeks in a row, followed by two weeks of vacation. This continues throughout the year. In Italy, students attend class six days per week, but finish at 1:30 PM each day, so that school does not dominate their life the way that it does in America ,where students attend high school from 7:45 AM until 3:00PM each week day. In areas where there are not enough classrooms, older students attend classes in the morning while the younger kids go to school in the afternoon.

School administrators and educational specialists fear that the three month- summer vacation stops the continuity of learning. Just as students become accustomed to new math equations or new concepts in reading, writing, critical thinking skills, they “shut down” for an extended period. When they go back to school after the long summer vacation, they take up to two months to return to their previous level of proficiency. And so, the debate continues to seek changes based on the Los Angeles or the Japanese models.

Always remember that anti-aging creams with chemicals in them can actually age you instead of reversing aging. If these anti-aging products are not effective, they may, in fact, do more harm than good and your skin may be vulnerable to irritation and sunburn whenever you use them.

However, there are several ways to help you increase the collagen in your skin. You have to know what nutrients your body really needs to help boost collagen. Dark green vegetables such as spinach and cabbage are excellent examples of food containing collagen producing agents. They are packed with antioxidants. You need 10 mg everyday for better results. A recent French research suggests that eating dark vegetables will boost skin hydration and fight wrinkles. They help to strengthen the body's ability to manufacture collagen and to utilise the protein effectively. Vitamin C- rich fruits and vegetables are also natural sources of collagen production. You should try to include fruits like oranges, lemons and strawberries into your daily diet. Similarly Omega Acids help to create an ideal environment for collagen production. Fish such as salmon and tuna are excellent sources of omega fatty acids. Nuts such as cashews and almonds contain healthy amounts as well.

If you really want to build your skin's elasticity and overall health, go the natural route. Drink the prescribed eight glasses of water a day and eat a balanced diet. Massaging is another secret. As when you massage your face daily, this will boost the production of collagen and give skin a more **plump** appearance. It's advisable to stop smoking as smoking creates enzymes which damage the collagen in your skin. Start shopping for foods **that** will actually help you re-grow the collagen you have lost instead of investing in expensive anti-aging creams. Consequently, you will soon see a difference in the quality of your skin tone, as well as have an improved sense of overall health.

Today, when spices are cheaper and more widely available, it seems unbelievable that they were once a royal luxury and those men were willing to risk their lives to acquire them. In 1497, four tiny ships sailed southward from Portugal in two-year journey, under the guidance of Captain Vasco da Gama. He was searching for a new route to the spice lands of Asia. Although only two of the four ships returned safely to their home port, they brought back a cargo of spices worth 60 times the cost of the voyage, making da Gama a wealthy man. Rich people were eager to exchange **their** gold for his pepper and cinnamon. Cinnamon was particularly valued for use in funeral ceremonies when a wealthy person died. Vanilla was another favorite of the rich because, when mixed with cacao, it made a previously unknown, delicious drink. Pepper was the most precious spice of all, often used as a form of money, particularly when rent had to be paid.

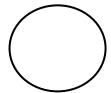
The people of those times used spices, as we do today, to improve or vary the flavors of their food. Spices were also used to **disguise** the taste of food that was not fresh. Without the addition of spices it would have been too unpleasant to eat. In times when there was no refrigeration, spices were also used for preserving food, such as meat, for a year or more. In the 16th century, cloves were commonly used both to preserve food and for medicinal purposes. It is fascinating to note that cloves are still used in the same way in some modern food. Later, mustard and ground mustard were also found to have preservative qualities. When spices were not available, people often went hungry because they could not prevent their food from going bad.

Many people around the world work in very difficult conditions to produce spices for us. Much of the work is done by hand and very specific skills are needed. These skills have been handed down from generation to generation, but there is now some concern that younger people no longer want to do this sort of work because they prefer to go to the cities and work in office jobs.



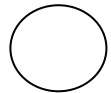

These are the questions that fast food companies worry about when **they** produce commercials or print ads for their products. Video and photo shoots often last many hours. The lights that the photographers use can be extremely hot. These conditions can cause the food to look quite unappealing to potential consumers. Because of this, the menu items that you see in fast food commercials are probably not actually edible.

Let's use the hamburger as an example. The first step towards building the perfect commercial hamburger is the bun. The food stylist—a person employed by the company to make sure the products look perfect—sorts through hundreds of buns until he or she finds one with no wrinkles. Next, the stylist carefully rearranges the sesame seeds on the bun using glue and tweezers for maximum visual appeal. The bun is then sprayed with a waterproofing solution so that it will not get **soggy** from contact with other ingredients, the lights, or the humidity in the room. Next, the food stylist shapes a meat patty into a perfect circle. Only the outside of the meat gets cooked—the inside is left raw so that the meat remains moist. The food stylist then paints the outside of the meat patty with a mixture of oil, molasses, and brown food coloring. Grill marks are either painted on or seared into the meat using hot metal skewers. Finally, the food stylist searches through dozens of tomatoes and heads of lettuce to find the best-looking produce. One leaf of the crispest lettuce and one center slice of the reddest tomato are selected and then sprayed with glycerin to keep them looking fresh.

So the next time you see a delectable hamburger in a fast food commercial, remember: you're actually looking at glue, paint, raw meat, and glycerin! Are you still hungry?

Fasting Ramadan is one of the main pillars of Islam .Today, many people are trying to discover the benefits of fasting. Some people fast for spiritual reasons ,while others fast as a way to physically discipline the body. Whatever reasons one might come up with, it has been scientifically proved that fasting has **tremendous** healthy, spiritual and social benefits.

First, fasting plays an important role in the detoxification of the body. Detoxification is a normal body process of removing or neutralizing toxins or harmful things through the colon, liver, kidneys, lungs, skin and other organs. As food no longer enters the body, **it** turns to fat reserves for energy. When the fat reserves are used during fast, the body releases the chemicals from the fatty acids into the system which are then removed through the body organs, leading to the cleansing of the whole body.

Another benefit of fasting is the healing process that is obvious in the body during a fast. When fasting, energy is diverted away from the digestive system due to its lack of use and moves towards the metabolism process and immune system. The healing process during a fast is made easy by the body's search for energy sources. Abnormal growths within the body, tumours and the like, do not have the full support of the body's supplies and therefore are more likely to disappear.

Fasting also has spiritual and social benefits. It leads to a feeling of new youth and extended life expectancy. This might be due to the detoxification effect of fasting. A study showed that fasting leads to the extension of life. The experiment was performed by isolating one *earthworm and putting it on a cycle of fasting and feeding. The isolated earthworm outlived the other earthworms by generations, while still maintaining its freshness and youthful physiological characteristics. Moreover, fasting enables the wealthier members of the society to realize the bad conditions of the poor. They feel sorry for them and begin to do something for their welfare. This produces acts of charity which arouse a feeling of happiness and gratitude amongst the poor for their rich brothers and sisters. Cooperation among rich Muslims and poor ones is at its best during Ramadan. All these good acts that are generated by fasting contribute to the improvement and empowerment of the society as a whole.

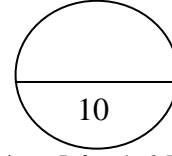
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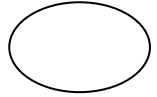

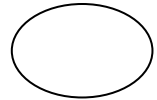

Thus, his connections with the theatre made him a wealthy man.

Shakespeare died in 1616. Some years earlier he chose a gravestone, under which he was to be buried. He had a curse engraved on this stone **which** threatened to bring misfortune to anyone who might remove his body from his grave.

It seems strange that he should have had this fear. He must have known how greatly he was respected, even in his lifetime, for the genius that he showed in his plays and poems. It seems impossible that his remains could have been disturbed after his death.
