

The most primitive way of exchange should be the barter trade. In this form of transaction, people used goods to exchange for the things that they had in mind. For instance, if person wanted a book and he had a spare goat, he must look for someone who had the exact opposite. Many years later, the cumbersome barter trade finally gave way to the monetary form of exchange when the idea of money was invented. In the early days, almost anything could qualify as money: beads, shells and even fishing hooks. Then in a region near Turkey, gold coins were used as money. In the beginning, each coin had a different denomination. It was only later, in about 700 BC, that Gyges, the king of Lydia, standardized the value of each coin and even printed his name on the coins.

Monetary means of **transaction** at first beat the traditional barter trade. However, as time went by, the thought of carrying a ponderous pouch of coins for shopping appeared not only troublesome but thieves attracting. Hence, the Greek and Roman traders who bought goods from people faraway cities, invented checks to solve the problem. Not only are paper checks easy to carry around, but **they** also discouraged robbery as these checks can only be used by the person whose name is printed on the notes. Following this idea, banks later issued notes in exchange for gold deposited with them. These bank notes can then be used as cash.

Finally, governments of today adopted the idea and began to print paper money, backed by gold for the country's use. Today, besides enjoying the convenience of using paper notes as the mode of exchange, technology has led man to invent other means of transaction too like the credit and cash cards.



Fires are to blame for the loss of countless lives and billions of dollars every year. Firefighters help protecting people and their property from injury and damage and <u>they</u> put their life on the line every time they respond to a call.

While on duty, firefighters must be ready to respond in a matter of minutes to just about any disaster that may occur. At every scene, a superior fire officer takes command and directs the jobs of all the personnel at the scene. Some firefighters operate hose lines to hydrants while others manually operate the pumps to send water to the hoses. Teams of firefighters also operate ladders used to reach distances high in the air.

In addition to responding and handling fire calls, firefighters provide emergency medical services as well. The Majority of calls that firefighters respond involve emergency medical situations. They receive a great deal of emergency medical training. Many fire departments require that all employees be certified emergency medical technicians, when they are not helping someone in need, firefighters spend much of their time at fire stations. Each fire station that employs full-time firefighters usually has a **dormitory** facility where firefighters can sleep when working long shifts. When the alarm sounds in the fire stations, firefighters rush into action, regardless of time day or weather.

In the line of duty, firefighters encounter a variety of harmful substances. They are highly trained to deal with these substances. They are often exposed to high temperatures, smoke and a variety of harmful gases. In some cases, they are exposed to radioactive and hazardous materials that have a long –term negative effect on their health.

To help firefighters do their job in such extreme conditions, they use the latest fire **prevention** technology available to them. They wear a fire retardant coats and pants that can withstand very high temperatures. They wear boots that withstand even greater temperatures, in cases they actually have to walk on a structure that is swallowed in flames. They also usually wear helmets that are equipped with oxygen masks that help them breathe in smoke- filled areas that are filled with harmful gases.

Pollution is any contamination of the environment, which causes harm to the environment and the inhabitants. There are many kinds of pollution; air, soil, and water. Some less harmful, which are radioactive noise, light pollution, and greenhouse gases.

Air pollution can be caused by particles, liquids, or gases that make the air harmful to breathe. There are two main types of air pollution: primary and secondary. Soil pollution can be caused by pesticides, leakage from chemical tanks and oil flows. It can also cause water pollution when underground water becomes infected by coming into contact with the polluted soil. Water pollution can be caused by waste products, sewage, oil flows, and <u>litter</u> in rivers, lake and oceans. Some scientists believe that water pollution is the largest cause of death and disease in the world causing about 14,000 deaths in the world each day.

Noise pollution can be caused by vehicle, aircraft, and industrial noise. It can also be caused by military or experimental sonar. Noise has health effects on people and animals. In people, it can cause high blood pressure, heart problems, sleep disturbances, and hearing problems. In animals, it can cause communication, reproductive, and navigation problems – <u>they</u> have difficulty finding their direction.

In addition, greenhouse gases have caused a warming effect on the earth's climate. The greenhouse gases are water vapor, carbon dioxide, methane, and ozone. They are naturally–occurring gases in the atmosphere, but human activity has increased their concentration in the atmosphere. For example, the levels of carbon dioxide (CO2) in the atmosphere have risen due to the burning of fossil fuels. The effect is a rise in global temperatures. The higher temperatures cause the **melting** of glaciers, a rise in the water level of oceans, and the damaging of both land and marine life, including that of humans. Although carbon dioxide is necessary for plants to survive, it is also considered to be a kind of pollution because high levels of carbon dioxide have caused the oceans to become more acidic.

When we are young, we learn that tigers and sharks are dangerous. We might be scared of them because they are big and powerful. As we get older, however, we learn that sometimes the most dangerous animals are also the smallest animals. In fact, the animal that kills many people every year is the mosquito.

While it may seem that all mosquitoes are biters, this is not actually the case. Male mosquitoes eat plant nectar. Female mosquitoes feed on animal blood. They need this blood to live and produce eggs. When a female mosquito bites a human being, it <u>transmits</u> a small amount of saliva into the blood. The result of the bite can be as <u>minor</u> as an itchy bump or as serious as death.

Because a mosquito can bite many people in the course of its life, it can carry diseases from one person to another. Two of the most deadly diseases carried by mosquitoes are malaria and yellow fever. More than 700 million people become sick from these diseases every year. At least 2 million of these people die from these diseases.

Many scientists are working on safer ways to kill mosquitoes, but so far, there is no sure way to protect everyone in the world from their bites. Mosquito nets can be placed over beds to protect people against being bitten. These nets help people stay safe at night, but they do not kill any mosquitoes. Mosquitoes have many natural enemies like bats, birds, dragonflies, and fish. Bringing more of these animals into places where mosquitoes live might help to cut down the amount of mosquitoes in that area. This is a natural solution, but it does not always work very well. Mosquitoes can also be killed with poisons. Even though these sprays kill mosquitoes, <u>they</u> may also harm other plants or animals.

Although mosquitoes may not seem as scary as larger more powerful animals, they are far more dangerous to human beings, but things are changing. It is highly likely that one-day scientists will find a way to keep everyone safe from mosquitoes and the diseases they carry.
